2.	<p>Strategic Clinical Network update</p>	
	<p>JM - SCN update – NHS England review of networks postponed. Now due no later than Jan 16. Improved links wanted by AHSN and SCN. SSG group support agreed including long term funding by providers. Main voluntary providers are Macmillan for LWBC & CRUK for early diagnosis</p> <p>Funding was sought for GP's to attend cancer education course. HEE bid for practice nurse training unsuccessful. UWE and Macmillan discussing how to move this forward. Would like 1 day training for practice nurses. Possibility of practice nurses doing CCR and earning QOF points.</p> <p>Awaiting Cancer Strategy report due approx. 1/12. JM attended GP masterclass in Exeter ?Plymouth to do something similar ?can we do something similar locally with GP's and CCG's</p> <p>H&WB evaluation needed to be consistent in order to meet commissioning needs ?need academic assistance to achieve this</p> <p>Directory of services created at UHBristol but now out of date. Need to create something interactive</p> <p>Aim for event aimed at CCG's, finance managers – autumn. Updates from</p>	<p>ALL</p> <p>JM</p> <p>ALL</p>

3.	Commissioning Update	
4.1	<p>Weston – agreed £300K CQuin for recovery package in breast, colorectal & urology</p> <p>Bristol – agreement in place to fund UHB recovery package activity on a block contract based on cost neutral activity with associated reduction in follow-up; For NBT a £125 tariff has been agreed for HNA, TS & H&WB event.</p> <p>Cancer Service User project group in place commissioned by Bristol CCG – stakeholder meeting held in Feb to try and understand key areas for moving forward in order to create the whole pathway. Business case being prepared for 2016/17.</p> <p>Glos LWBC – Breast, colorectal, prostate – creating stratified pathways, 2 yr CQuin: Yr1 – developing recovery package; yr 2 implementing recovery package with built in targets. GP masterclasses ongoing; well attended 60-70 each time. CNS and consultants attend. Part of GP practice commitment programme. Cancer is mandatory component – need this across the region. Includes Locum GP's. Launch day end Sept for all stakeholders</p> <p>Glos CCG signed up to this but detail not yet agreed. Budget £500K</p> <p>H&WB days – some will be site specific. Core generic sessions will be held (for any tumour) then signposted to other services such as physical activity, nutrition (more site specific). Exact format to be agreed</p>	
4.	Trust Updates	
	<p>WGH – CQuin as mentioned previously. Breast H&WB events running, TS using SCR. Signed up to eHNA. Not changed f-up yet. RM system needs aligning with existing IT systems. To expand across other sites by end of year. Applied for a Macmillan funded B4 support worker and CNS support</p> <p>RUH – eHNA pilot but problems with IT support. Run nurse-led breast clinics (funded) but not funded in prostate. Using paper HNA in breast. TS built into main hospital system. Urology TS awaiting final sign off. Trial with bladder first. Prostate H&WB part of True North project (PCUK and Movember). Evaluated by Surry and Southampton Unis.</p> <p>Taunton – TS in radiotherapy. Discussions with chemo to develop oncology TS. PROMs survey with all pelvic pts since Beacon opened. 524 questionnaires sent out – return rate of 74%. Resulted in 4 oncology appts, 39 late effects appts, 90 telephone triage, 164sent info out, 23 erectile dysfunction referrals, 12 other – counselling, fatigue, CAB, dietetics. Hoping to expand to other radiotherapy areas.</p>	

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	<p>eHNA pilot – capacity issues. Gynae & skin first. Skin dropped out for 6/12 now recommenced. H&WB – 3 per year breast with associated reduction in follow-up (1 appt). Lymphoma event pilot being held next week. Large generic event held in March – gynae breast, colorectal, prostate, skin – 300 people attended with 45 market stalls</p> <p>UHB – eHNA issues with sign off. Paper copies at present. H&WB generic events with site specific components being run every 2/12. Supported by Macmillan Cancer Support Workers and collected on ICE system. Set up as clinics on Medway</p> <p>Treatment Summary – CQuin 0-25% achieved. Used SCR initially but now same content on a dictated template. Saved onto CDS and accessed by GP's. Have replaced discharge letters and done at end of each primary treatment. Up to 40% this year required but now need to get all teams to be involved. Include active monitoring patients eg lymphoma watch and wait</p> <p>Macmillan Cancer Support Worker roles now funded longer term. Pathway stratification work ongoing</p> <p>NBT – site specific Living Well Day's run at different intervals. Living Well Courses run in breast, colorectal, skin and prostate</p> <p>Prostate Cancer UK pilot just about to finish. Might do generic LWC for smaller tumour sites. TS CQuin as UHB. Some on SCR and some own templates. MCSW's now substantive and also have increased admin support which frees up CNS time. Macmillan Wellbeing Centre acts as a hub for info and support</p> <p>Discussion of how to include sites with poorer outcomes such as lung. UHB looking at recovery package for more palliative groups. CN speaking at SW Lung CNS meeting next week – recovery package implementation will be discussed</p> <p>Glos – currently doing all activity on paper system. Purchased new IT system but not ready for go live until Nov 16. Oncology module not yet built. Not using SCR so everything done in individual teams. Variable use of recovery package</p>
