Plymouths Acute Oncology Service

Development and implementation of the Acute Oncology Service (AOS) at Derriford Hospital as taken place throughout 2013. We have been able to recruit and appoint all of the staff required to run the service and were, therefore, able to become fully operational in October 2013.

The AOS Team consists of a lead consultant, lead clinical nurse specialist (CNS) for AOS and CUP patients, CNS/cord-compression coordinator, an administrator and is supported by ten consultant oncologists. On each of the five working days of the service a consultant oncologist is available for four hours to assess and review patients.

The aim of our service is to facilitate the timely, efficient and holistic care of people with cancer in the 'un-planned' or emergency setting. This service also incorporates the Cancer of Unknown Primary Service.

Since the service has been operational it has seen 465 patients.
