

Maintaining Momentum

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All actions at the national level either completed or on the way to being completed.

- Police custody used in England 3,996 times in 2014/15, down from 6,028 times in previous year – decrease of 33.7%
- Under 18s, a 33.8% reduction from 236 to 145.
- Review of Urgent and Emergency Care, includes ‘Vanguards’ and links ‘System Resilience’ to CCC
- CQC thematic review of crisis care and report ‘Right Here, Right Now’



- We need a united front when it comes to crisis care.
- Local mental health services need to be available 24-hours a day, 7 days a week.

- 3.21. ...There is much more to be done to ensure mental and physical health are considered equal...We expect NHS England to strive to close the health gap between people with mental health problems, learning disabilities and autism and the population as a whole, and support people to lead full, healthy and independent lives. **As part of this, we expect new mental health access and waiting time standards to be embedded and expanded and crisis care to be improved for people of all ages.**


“People who are in crisis should be helped to stabilise within a short period. We do not want to incentivise paying for poor outcomes. Consideration could be given to paying separately for clusters 14 and 15 only when a service user is experiencing their first contact with a secondary mental health provider.

A crisis will often be resource intensive for a limited time, after which an evidence based package of care should be in put in place.”

- CAMHS transformation funding is **£1.25billion** over 5 years for children's MH.
- **£30m** investment in liaison psychiatry from NHSE this year (non-recurrent)
- Additionally, **£30m** annually recurrent for eating disorders
- **£15m** (non-recurrent) for 2016/17, to reduce use of police cells for people detained under s136

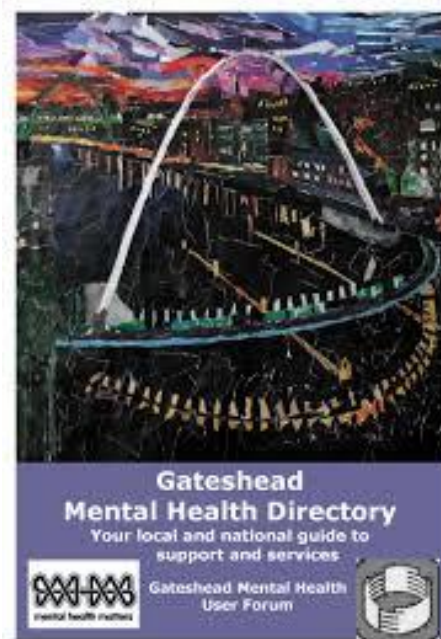
