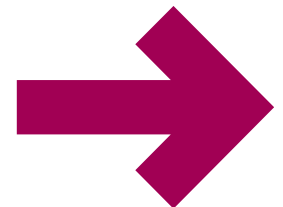
Some of the changes and challenges

- The move from local oversight to national (Nb old SCG arrangements for some regions)
- Some changes in community provision
- ?Increasing demand and needs of the patient group?
- Pressure from the Social Care and Education sectors
- Complicated discharge arrangements at times
- Increasing emphasis on the needs of section 136 C&YP
- Locally constrained capacity with the temporary closure of Wessex House
- A number of units nationally having reduced access due to concerns
- No subspecialised units with the South West

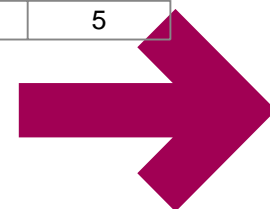
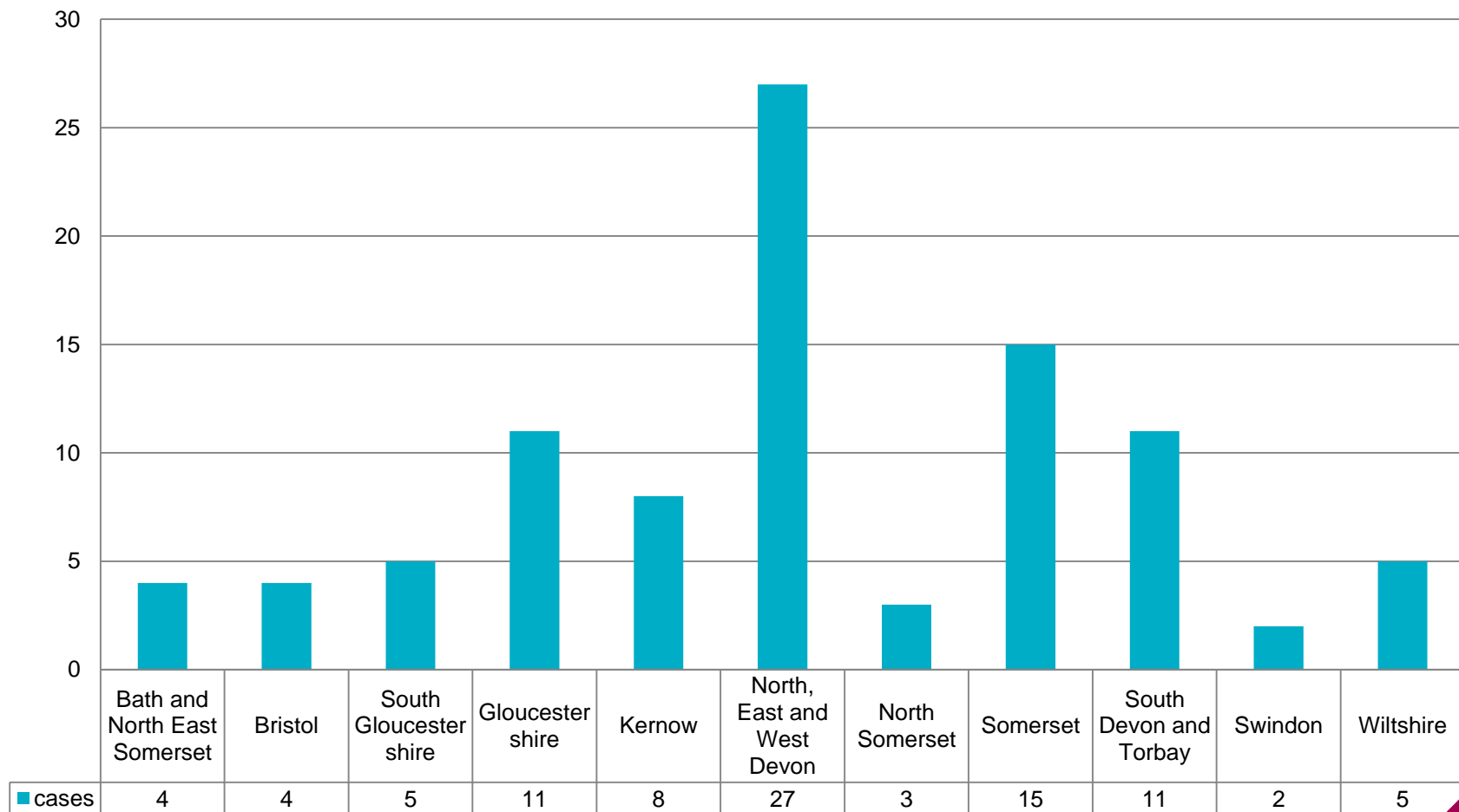


Bed Capacity

- Riverside (Bristol) 10 Generic Beds
- Plymbridge (Plymouth) 12 Generic Beds
- Marlborough House (Swindon) 12 Generic Beds
- Wessex House (Bridgwater) due to re-open in November with a phased programme
- Phase *one* procurement – more on this later
- Phase *two* procurement – more on this later

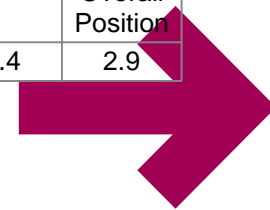
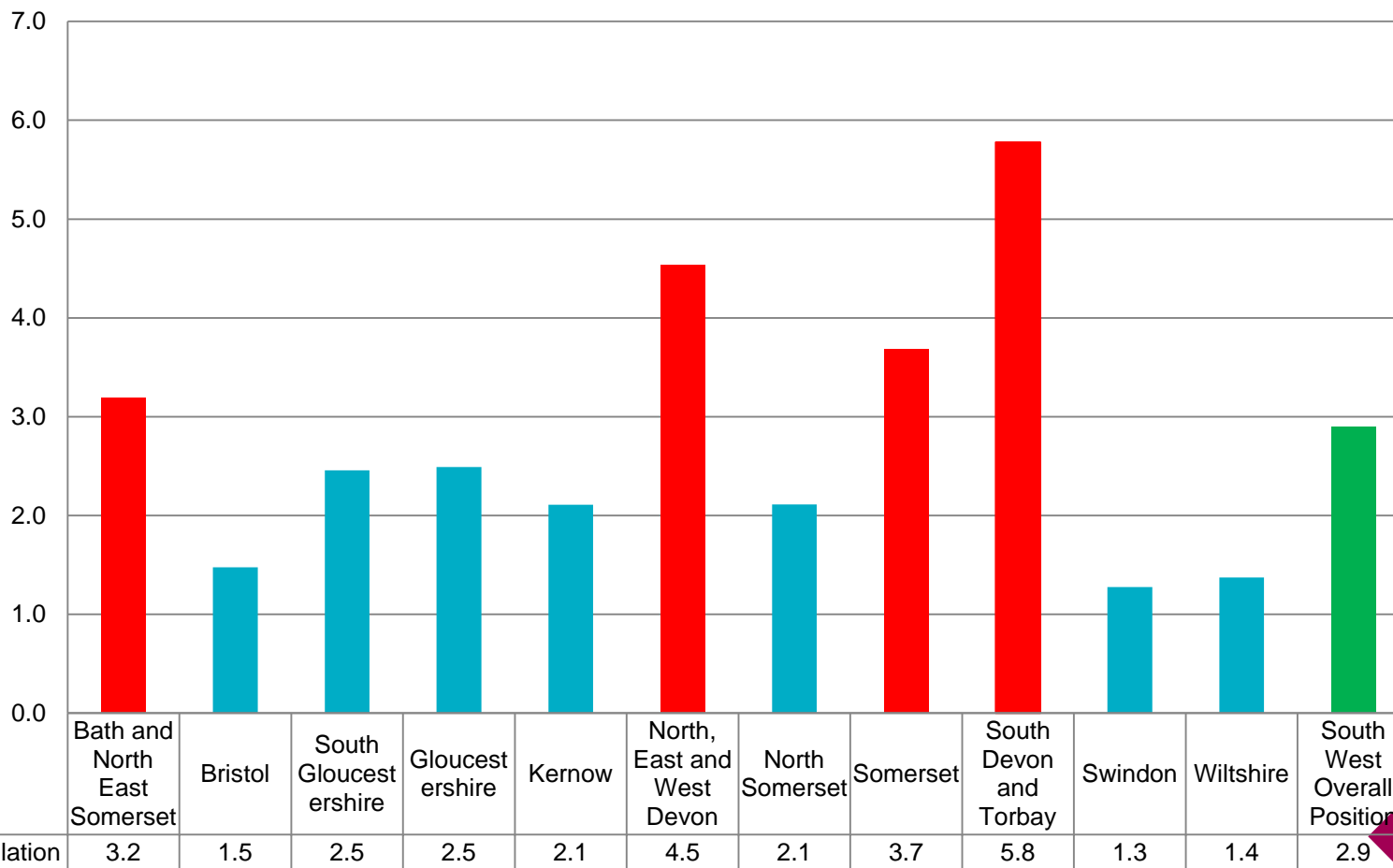


Cases by CCGs



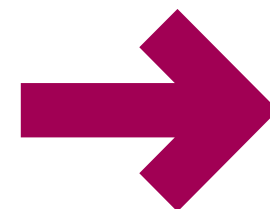
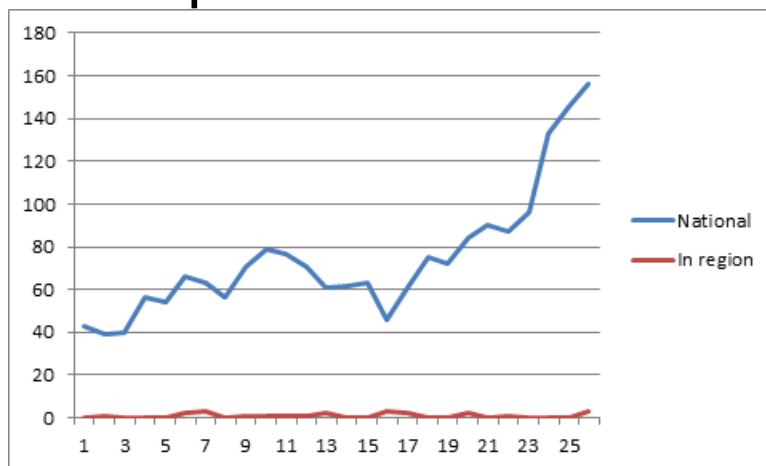
Cases by population by CCGs

rate /10,000 population



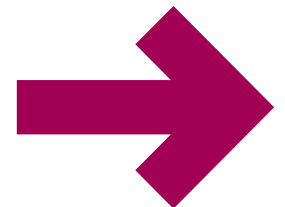
What has been done nationally

- National bed oversight, the Friday calls..
- The national review as referred to earlier
- Seen an increase in the number of beds actually available from 5% to c 10-15%, due to:-
 - Increase in number of beds commissioned
 - The positive impact a of Case Management



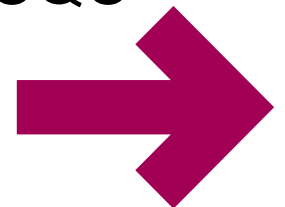
What has been done locally

- Today - the recognition the CAMHs is not all about beds..
- The better understanding of enhanced community services as seen through the work today and the opportunities to the patients, carers and tax payer
- Case Managers... (will be substantive posts in the new structure)
- Interim escalation protocol being worked with in a couple of CCG areas prior to roll out
- Virtual “pooled” budget being developed as a concept on a pilot basis - support the development of co-commissioning
- Public Health needs analysis being worked upon



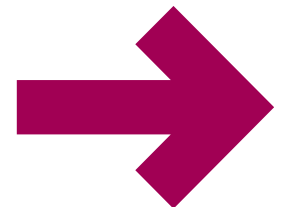
Phase one procurement

- Open to providers who currently provide T4 CAMHS services.
- Providers were asked if they could provide interim generic and/or PiCU short term beds until March 2015.
- In region this has resulted in 1 provider being able to provide a further 6 generic beds and 3 PiCU beds in the Torquay area.
- The beds are expected to come on line in Nov but they will not be commissioned until a full compliance visit had been undertaken by NHS England and CQC



Phase two procurement

- Procurement exercise open to all providers who wish to be considered for tendering for CAMHS services.
- The timing and progression of this work is being finalised.
- Providers will be invited to a launch day over the coming months. The provision of services will be on a needs basis and will not look to provide every kind of specialised service within each area.
- How do we involve the local community within this.. can you influence?
