At each stage it has been modelled against the costs of care, both financially to the commissioner and personally and emotionally to person and her family. The four scenarios are on:

- Multi-morbidity
- Colorectal cancer
- Progressive chronic kidney disease
- Parkinson's disease

New Electronic Palliative Care Coordination (EPaCCS) system: BNSSG CCGs are making progress implementing Stage one of the EPaCCS project. End of Life (EoL) information is recorded via an EMIS EoL template in the patient's GP Practice. This template is based on extensive local clinical consultation and the National Information Standard.

The GP EoL record will be shared across the health community via the Connecting Care portal from 22nd February. All services should look in Connecting Care for EoL information not the Adastra EoL Register and staff should have a Connecting Care licence to access EoL accurate patient information.
